Upcoming Training Series- Healing Financial Harms, Building Financial Access

The <u>Promoting Employment Opportunities for Survivors of Trafficking</u> (PEOST) Training and Technical Assistance Project is hosting a two-part training series on the financial harm many trafficking survivors face, how to heal from it, and where to find access to financial products and services that help them build/rebuild economic stability.

Description For Sessions:

- August 20, 2025- Part 1: Healing Financial Harms
 - Financial harm is a core yet often overlooked consequence of sex and labor trafficking.
 Survivors may carry deep emotional wounds related to money, shaped by control, exploitation, and compromised economic identity. This 90minute workshop provides a foundation for understanding financial harms and the emotional complexities it creates. Participants will examine

what is disrupted during exploitation and why traditional financial literacy models often fall short. Participants and presenters will explore how integrating emotional awareness and survivorcentered approaches can begin to restore a sense of power, stability, and hope.

- August 27, 2025- Part 2: Building Financial Access
 - According to a Polaris 2023 report, survivors of human trafficking are two times more likely to be unbanked and excluded from traditional financial services. This webinar is led by the financial inclusion organization, Juntos Avanzamos, to explore how survivors of human trafficking can access banking tools through their network. Presenters will highlight safe banking standards, examples of financial inclusion efforts, and the importance of cross-sector collaboration to increase access to banking accounts, loans and other critical financial tools for survivors and their communities.
