Three Key Actions for PCAs:

- 1. **Partner** with domestic/sexual violence (DSV) coalitions to strengthen policy efforts and promote partnerships between HCs and DSV programs. Coalitions operate in every U.S. state and territory, and for Tribes. Reach out to staff from your local coalition to collaborate and map member programs:

- 2. **Introduce CUES** (Confidentiality, Universal Education, and Support), an evidence-based intervention, to your HCs. CUES educates all patients about relationships, the health impact of IPV, and supportive resources. This differs from screening by giving all patients information on the health impact of IPV and safety support, regardless of their disclosure of current or past violence. Learn more.
